KAU INOA To Build a Nation

Kau Inoa depends on you to spread the word about this first step of the nation building process. Your active participation in encouraging other Hawaiians to register will assist in forming an organized Hawaiian community who will build the Hawaiian nation. Kau Inoa currently has approximately 70,000 Hawaiians registered as of June 2007. If each registered Hawaiian went out and got one other Hawaiian to register for Kau Inoa, then we could double that number in the blink of an eye. The following questions and answers are meant to educate you and any one who may ask about Kau Inoa.

Q. Since step one is Registration and step two is Apportionment, what is step three?

A. Step three is the Election of Delegates to Convention. As a registrant with Kau Inoa, you

have the option of submitting your name as a candidate in your district and those who are elected will be delegates at the Nation Building Convention.

Q. How will OHA or Kau Inoa help Native Hawaiians who chose not to enroll or be a part of Kau Inoa?

A. We encourage all Hawaiians to participate in Kau Inoa because it is how your voice will be heard in the nation-building process. Signing up is a way for you to give us the opportunity to contact you with information about the nation building process. If you have a different opinion about nation-building, it becomes even more important that you sign up so your viewpoint can be debated in the nation building process. If you don't sign up, we have no way of knowing who you are, how to reach

you, or even whether you are Native Hawaiian.

Q. How can non-Hawaiians support Kau Inoa if they can't sign up?

A. They can encourage all of their Hawaiian friends and 'ohana to sign up. A Non-Hawaiian mother or father may sign up their children if their children are Hawaiian.

Q. Is Kau Inoa really for or a part of the Akaka Bill?

A. No, Kau Inoa is not a part of the Akaka Bill and does not take a stand one way or the other about the Akaka Bill. Kau Inoa is a registry in the nation building process that will continue regardless of whether or not the Akaka Bill passes. As a part of Kau Inoa, YOU may choose to support or not support the Akaka Bill, but Kau Inoa is not connected to the Akaka Bill. ▣
